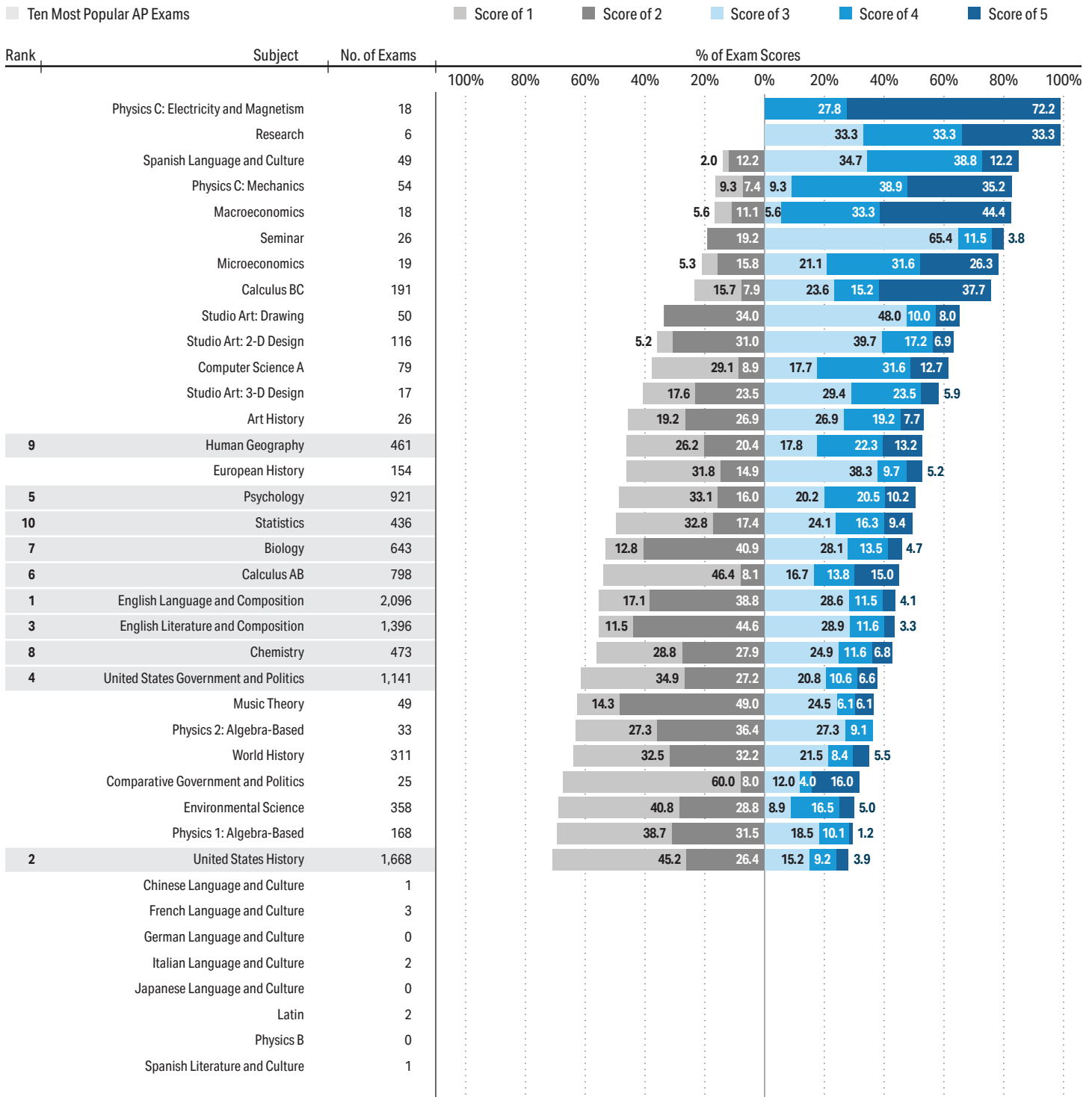

Score distributions for subjects with fewer than five AP Exam takers were omitted from this figure.

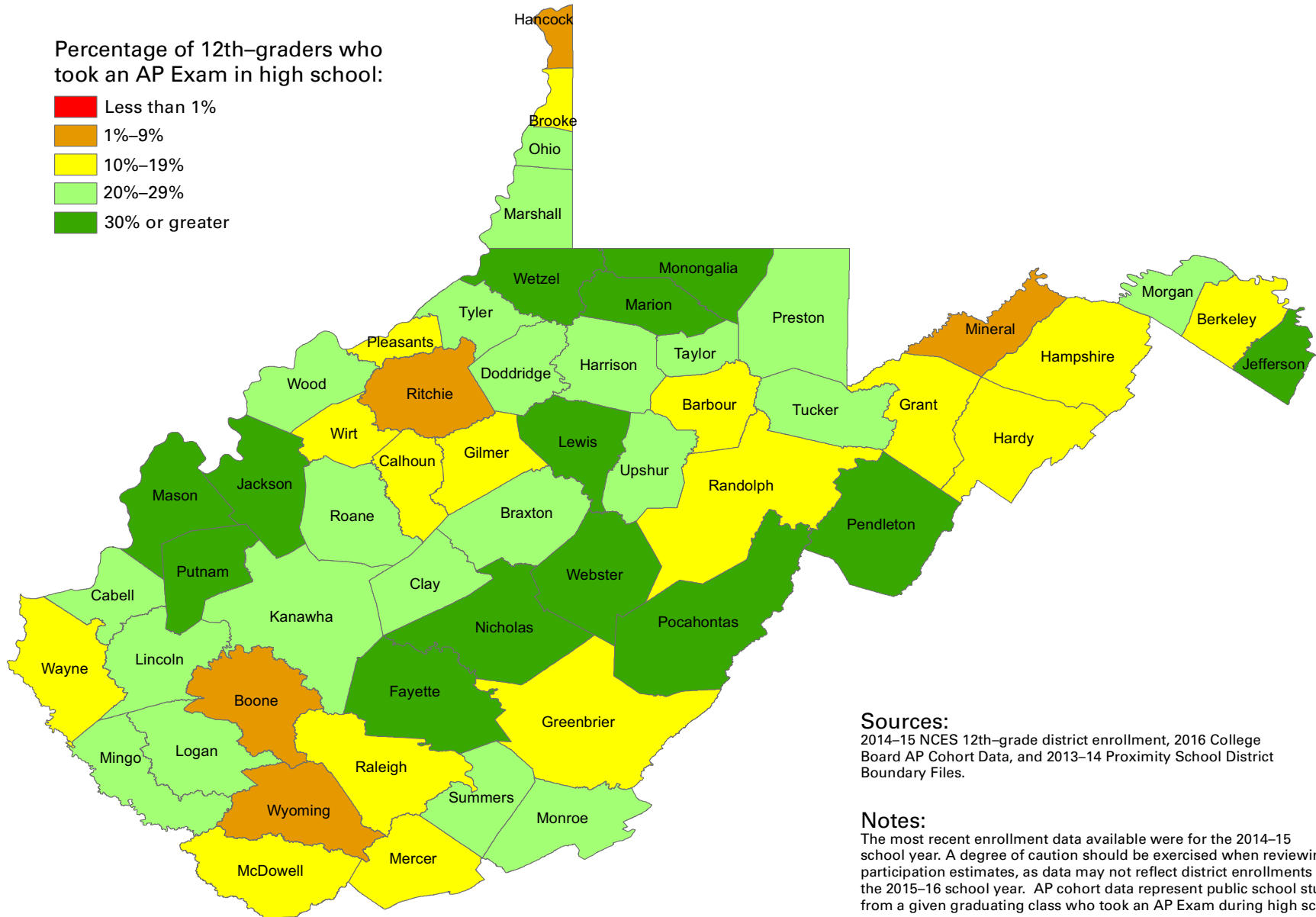
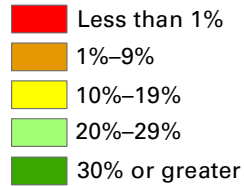
